MAYORS STANDING TOGETHER FOR CANTERBURY

SUCCESS OF DIRECT FLIGHTS FROM CHINA

The Mayoral Forum was delighted to welcome Jin Zhijian, Consul-General, and Liu Lian, Consul, from the People's Republic of China, to the February Mayoral Forum meeting.

Consul-General Jin told Mayors that New Zealand is now in the top ten travel destinations for people from China, and is likely to become more popular. Direct flights to Christchurch from Guangzhou on China Southern Airlines have been running three times a week since 17 December 2015, and booking rates have shown this to be a success.

To capitalise on the economic benefits of tourism in the Canterbury region, it is clear that we need to look at:

- a shortage of four and five star hotel accommodation for visitors
- better promotion of attractions in Canterbury
- removing language barriers, for example, through multi-lingual signage. Consul-General Jin offered the Consul's assistance to local service providers who wish to learn Chinese.

Consul-General Jin also spoke about Chinese overseas investment, noting that while Chinese investors recognise the importance of New Zealand, it can be difficult to identify the right projects.

The Canterbury region needs to be proactive in attracting overseas investment. Councils can help with this by identifying and pre-consenting appropriate sites for hotel developments, assisting investors to connect with developers, and ensuring clear and accurate information is available to prospective investors.

MAYORAL FORUM MEETING, 26 FEBRUARY 2016

The Mayoral Forum approved the Canterbury Digital Strategy 2016. This strategy has been developed collaboratively with Connected Canterbury, and is about getting fast broadband and mobile coverage across the Canterbury region, to help enable economic development and social wellbeing. The Forum also discussed progress on other work programmes in the Canterbury Regional Economic Development Strategy, local government collaboration in Canterbury, the work of the Chief Executives Forum, and the Canterbury Water Management Strategy Quarterly Report.
