CANTERBURY POLICY FORUM

The Canterbury Policy Forum met on 2 February 2018 and discussed:

- recent Government developments and what they might mean for Canterbury. This included:
 - implementation of the new Government's first 100-Day plan
 - Minister Parker's visit to Canterbury on 16 January 2018 to view the implementation of the Canterbury Water Management Strategy (CWMS) in the Selwyn-Waihora catchment



- identifying opportunities for Canterbury regional forums to engage with and influence longer term government policy and initiatives.
- a round table discussion on draft 2018–2028 Long-Term Plans, including key changes, new projects and impact on ratepayers
- continuing previous discussions on addressing the biodiversity challenge, focusing on national-level developments and how to encourage investment opportunities to maximise the 'public good' benefits of biodiversity
- update on CREDS funding and implementation, including an update on the CREDS Regional Transport workstream
- updates from the Canterbury Planning Managers and the new Compliance Monitoring and Enforcement working group.
